

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Course Description

• A four-day basic infection prevention and control training course is prepared for health professionals engaged directly or indirectly in COVID-19 activities. It enables them to protect themselves, patients, and the community at large from infection.

Course Goal

■ To provide participants with the knowledge, skill, and attitude to make COVID-19 treatment facilities safe for patients, health care workers, as well as the community.

Learning Objective

By the end of this course, participant will be able to:

- ♣ Describe the IPC and WaSH strategies for COVID-19;
- ♣ Apply standard precaution to prevent COVID-19;
- ♣ Safely manage dead bodies in the context of COVID-19;
- Recognize transmission-based precaution measures during COVID-19;
- ♣ Demonstrate administrative, environmental and re-engineering control measures in controlling COVID-19
