



Course description

This five days training course is prepared to enable them to design messages, plan, coordinate, build capacity, organize, implement, and monitor of risk communication and community engagement activities.

Course Goal

To provide participants with knowledge, skill and attitude that are needed to properly manage risk communication and community engagement activities on public health emergency response.

Participants learning objectives:

By the end of this training course participants will be able to

- Describe the principles and components of Emergency Risk Communication
- Develop risk communication strategy
- Discuss Public Communication role for health emergencies response activities
- Demonstrate skills for community mobilization and Community Engagement
- Initiate coordination and stakeholder Engagement
- Apply Monitoring and evaluation tools on risk communication and community engagement activities

Participant selection criteria

Participants for this course should be individuals who are responsible in designing of messages, community leaders, public health experts, health education and promotion workers.

Method of evaluation

- Knowledge assessment (50%): post test
- Project assessment (50%): (message preparation, designed strategy)

Course

- Daily evaluation

Certification criteria

Participants will be certified when they score more than 80% in the summative assessment.

- Involved in emergency response
