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Course Description:

This basic surveillance training is prepared for four days to surveillance focal points and regional PHEM officers who are working on SARI/ILI surveillance and response. It will enable them to collect respiratory samples and epidemiological data, surveillance data management and surveillance data analysis and interpretation.

Course Goal:

To provide participants with necessary knowledge, skill and attitude needed to undertake SARI/ILI Surveillance.

Enabling Objectives:

By the end of this training course, the participants are able to:

- Describe virological, clinical and epidemiological aspects of common viral respiratory disease
- Identify SARI/ILI sentinel surveillance site selection criteria's
- Describe the surveillance approaches of common viral respiratory diseases
- Conduct SARI/ILI data collection, analysis, interpretation and reporting
- Apply SARI/ILI sample collection, handling, storage and facilitate transportation of specimens for testing.
- Outline the SARI/ILI surveillance data quality assurance and evaluation methods

Participant selection criteria

Participant of the training should be either

- National PHEM officers or
- Regional laboratory & PHEM officers working on SARI/ILI surveillance or
- SARI/ILI Sentinel site surveillance focal points and/or PHEM focal

Trainer's Selection Criteria

- Mandatory: Who took WHO SARI/ILI sentinel surveillance training with record of achievement certificate (≥80%)
- and/or engaged in the development of surveillance training material

• and/or involved in SARI/ILI Sentinel surveillance and response activities at national/regional level

Method of course evaluation

Certification criteria: participants who have attended 95% the basic SARI/ILI surveillance training

and scored the posttest evaluation above 70% will be

certified.

Course Venue: Training centers which can accommodate participants and trainers with adequate physical distance and ventilation

Course Duration: Four days

Course Composition: 32 participants per venue, 6 trainers
